Youth for My Youth India/Youth Special Annual Camp for Digital Literacy- 2025
Dated 2 to 8 January 2025
Report

Day One

Date 2 January 2025 At 2 pm, all the campers arrived from the college to go to the camp site. A total of 108 Students, 40 male and 98 female, left for the village of Parbhani, near Mauje Tattu, with the materials required for the camp. After going there, the volunteers cleaned the school accommodation as well as the school premises. After discussing with the villagers, they inquired and inspected the work to be done in the village. At 8.00 pm, a total of six groups of campers were formed after introducing the campers. The work to be done by the students in seven days was planned. A group leader and a sub-group leader were selected from each group and given the responsibility of that group.

Day Two

On the second day of the camp, i.e. on January 3, 2025, the campers who participated in the camp did exercise, pranayama, and yoga from 5 to 7 am. After this, the first groups took the prapath. This included various aspects such as prayer, good thoughts, parables, quizzes, after which Shramdaan was done in the premises of the Zilla Parishad School from 8 to 10 am.

The inaugural program of the camp started at 11 am. Honorable Kailash Tidke, District Women and Child Development Officer, Parbhani, was present as the inaugurator and the chairman was Ma. Vice Principal Dr. Srinivas Keshetti. The chief guests on this occasion were Sarpanch Narayanrao Kadam, Vice Principal Prof Narayan Raut, Program Officer Dr Tukaram Fisfise, Gram Sevika Smt. Kakade, Paramedic Mauli Waghmare, Principal Rambhau Shinde, Tukaram Kadam, Kisanrao Kadam, Gram Panchayat Member Mauli Kadam, Nandu Ramji Kadam, Sadashiv Kadam, Vishwanathrao Kadam etc.

Speaking on this occasion, Kailash Tidke said that although our society is advanced in educational, social and material terms, many customs like dowry and child marriage exist in the society. The special camp of the National Service Scheme is making an important contribution to the upliftment of the society and the eradication of evil customs. In his presidential closing speech, Dr Srinivas Keshetti said that through such camps, it is possible to improve society and improve villages. Along with the students, it is necessary for the people of the village to participate in such camps in large numbers for village development. Vijay Parsode introduced the program. Dr. Tukaram Fisfise moderated the program and Prof. Vilas Kurhadkar proposed the vote of thanks.

The program was successfully conducted by the Executive Officer Prof. Savita Kokate. Dr. Digambar Rode, Prof. Sharad Kadam, Dr. Surendra Yenorkar, Prof. Rajesaheb Renge, Prof. Maya Rodge, Arun Kadam, Syed Sadik, Achyu Tarfade, Dasu Maske, etc. took the initiative. 138 students including villagers were present at this time. The program concluded with the national anthem.

In the intellectual session from 3 to 5 pm, lectures were given by Dr. Bapu Bhosale on the topic of environmental conservation and today's youth, Dr. O. L. Chilgar on the topic of complementary agriculture, and Shri Hanumant Hambir on the topic of the role of youth in national development. On this occasion, Dr. Bhosale said that environmental conservation has become the need of the hour and various initiatives have been taken from the perspective of environmental conservation, but since they are not being implemented, the environmental problem is becoming serious. To conserve the environment, it is necessary for students, especially the National Service Scheme Department, to take the initiative and do important work. He asserted that conserving the environment will help in the development of the society and the country.

After this, he explained how important complementary businesses are from the point of view of economic development. On this occasion, he gave information about new complementary businesses. Among them, farmers can increase their income by doing some important businesses like fisheries, beekeeping and so on and improve their economic situation. He asserted that it is especially necessary for the youth to turn to such new complementary businesses.

After this, Shri Hanumant Hambir said that more than half of the population of the nation is youth. Only these youth can play an important role in the development of the nation. These youth need to make their significant contribution to the development of the nation. The future belongs to India and the role of youth in this development is important. He asserted that the youth should always be ready for national development without looking back. The program was moderated by Prakash Dhale and the vote of thanks was given by Rajesh Solunke.

From 6 to 7 pm, Shri Omprakash Yadav, Deputy Chief Executive Officer, Zilla Parishad, Parbhani, gave invaluable guidance to the students and villagers on the topic of rural development. Rural development is more dependent on the villagers of the village than on the government officials. If the villagers take it into their hearts, village development can happen. It is necessary to create such a mindset. The government can only implement various schemes for rural development, but its implementation mainly depends on the officials and the people of the village. The program was moderated by Program Officer Dr. Tukaram Fisfise and the vote of thanks was given by Dr. Vijay Parsode.

The Ghazal and Shayari program was concluded between 8 and 10 pm. At this time, Shri Chandrashekhar Kirwale explained various Ghazals to the students along with their meanings and also showed them from the village. The students and villagers responded well to these Ghazals and Shayari.

Day Three

On the third day of the camp, i.e. on January 4, 2025, from 5 to 7 am, Patanjali Yoga Arogyavardhini Yoga Teacher Shri Ashok Talekar explained the importance of Pranayama and Yogasana to the campers and

gave them lessons on Pranayama and Yogasana based on the scriptures. Program Officer Dr. Tukaram Fisfise, Prof. Rajesaheb Renge were present on this occasion. On this occasion, the campers of Group B presented the routine. After this, friendship and breakfast tea were taken at 8 pm. Shramdaan was done in the village from exactly 9 to 12 am. On this occasion, the main road of the village, the area around the school were cleaned. The main road of the village was cleaned by collecting garbage, dirt, and plastic from the road.

From 2 to 5 pm, Dr. G. S. Pise and Dr. Ganesh Marewad gave important guidance on the topic of disaster management in the intellectual field. At this time, Dr. Pise reviewed different disasters and guided the students of the National Service Scheme on how to play a role in that disaster. Disasters do not only occur in personal life but also occur from time to time in social life. If such disasters are to be averted, lessons of disaster management are important. This was stated by Dr. Ganesh Marewad. The program was conducted by Bhosale Vishnudas and Bhusare Devanand.

In the cultural session of the night, a poets' conference was held from 8 to 10 pm. Poets like Prof. Dr. Prahlad Bhope, poet Shankar Kadam, Kamlakar Dubey, Durga Deshmukh, Ujjwala Kadam participated in it, on this occasion all these poets presented their outstanding poems on various topics like soil, culture, farmers, love, girl, college, modern technology. On this occasion, Prof. Prahlad Bhope conducted the program and Dr. Tukaram Fisfise gave the vote of thanks. The villagers responded well to these poems.

Day Four

Date 5 January 2025 i.e. the fourth day of the camp. On this day, all the campers did exercise, pranayama and yoga from 5 to 7 in the morning. They were guided by a qualified teacher, Mr. Ashok Talekar. On this occasion, he convinced the students of the importance of yoga. After this, the routine was conducted by Group C. After that, breakfast and tea were taken at 8 o'clock. A free health check-up and treatment camp was organized from 9 to 11 in the morning. On this occasion, Dr. Lande, Dr. Shelke, members of the Satyasai Seva Samiti examined the patients of the village and gave them medicine. 110 patients of the village were examined this time. At the same time, at 9 in the morning, all the campers left for Shramdaan in the villages with materials. On this occasion, the drains in the village were cleaned. The silt in the drains of the village was removed and the clogged drains were cleaned, and drainage ditches were created in the villages. On this occasion, cleanliness was done in the village under the guidance of the program officer.

Bath and food were served from 12 to 2 pm. After that, the intellectual session started. In the intellectual session, Dr. Kalyan Gopnar guided on the topic of My Youth India, Prof. Dr. Ramesh Shinde on digital literacy, and Prof. Dr. Nana Shitole on water conservation and youth. While guiding on My Youth India, Prof. Kalyan Gopnar said that today's India is a country of youth and that is why the government has taken up various initiatives keeping these youth in mind. As a part of this, the government has started the My Youth India initiative. Through this initiative, all the youth of the country will be brought together and provided with an online platform and through it, various opportunities will be provided to them. He asserted that all the youth should take advantage of this.

After this, Dr. Ramesh Shinde guided on the topic of digital literacy, the modern world is a world of technology. Today, digitalization has taken place in all sectors. However, it is very important to be careful and vigilant while using digital tools, for which digital literacy is important. Lack of digital literacy can cause damage in many ways. If we want to avoid this loss, we should be well informed about digital tools. For this, it is necessary to be digitally literate.

Speaking on the topic of water conservation and youth, Nana Shitole said that water conservation has become a necessity of today. More than half of the earth is water, but this water is not drinkable. Water scarcity is emerging and many serious problems have arisen before the society due to this water scarcity. The coming times are very grim and water scarcity has emerged as a global problem. If this problem is to be solved, the role of youth is very important. Because if they take the initiative and undertake water conservation, it will definitely help in solving the serious problem of water, Shitole thought. The program was moderated by Nayak Vaishnavi and the vote of thanks was given by Vavle Pramod.

From 7 to 8 in the evening, from 6 to 7, Adv. Ramkishan Dhas guided the students on the importance of law for a developed India. At this time, he explained the concept of a developed India and convinced the students how important laws are for India. Many laws have been made for a developed India. It is necessary to know those laws first. If we study this law, we will realize its importance, so the youth should study such laws and play a role in implementing them well, he expressed his thoughts.

From 8 to 10 at night, Dr. Jagdish Naik guided the students on the topic of mental health. At this time, Dr. Jagdish Naik said that mental health has become a big problem in recent times. Because due to increasing technology and increasing expectations, human health has been endangered. Due to the huge mental stress, mental health is at risk today, so if we want to keep our mental health strong, people should keep their expectations low, do exercise and pranayama instead of getting addicted and get proper treatment from a doctor.

Day Five

Date 6 January 2025 i.e. on the fifth day of the camp, the camp and the program officer did yoga and pranayama in the morning, after which group C presented the routine. After that, breakfast and tea were taken. An animal inspection camp was held from 9 to 11 am. On this occasion, the animals in the village were vaccinated. For this, Livestock Officer Dr. Prahlad Bhise inspected the animals. He got the cooperation of Mr. Kadam. Shramdaan was done between 9 am and 12 pm. The area around the Mahadev temple in the village was cleaned. Trees were planted here and water was arranged and the surrounding area was cleaned.

In the afternoon, in the intellectual sector, Dr. Sunita Kukde guided on the need of the hour for the prevention of child marriage, Dr. Sudhir Ingle guided on the topic of social media and youth, and Dr. Vaibhav Pathak guided on the topic of Saheb Suraksha. Speaking on this occasion, Dr. Sunita Korde said that despite the increase in the literacy rate in the society, the number of divisions has not decreased. There is a social problem and a very common practice that is expected to be eradicated. It is not decreasing, but in the past few years, there has been an increase in child marriage. Parbhani district is number one in terms of child marriage, so preventing child marriage has become the need of the day. If

child marriage is to be prevented, the role of youth is important. For this, different measures are being taken at the government level, but she asserted that child marriage will not stop unless the youth and the society support it. After this, Dr. Sudhir Ingle spoke on the topic of social media and youth. Social media has become an important medium of communication today. The impact of social media on society is huge, but it is very important to be careful while using social media. Because social media is a double-edged sword. If it is used carefully, if it is used well, it would not be better, as many problems and questions can arise from this, so the youth should be careful while using social media and use it for good work. After this, Vaibhav Pathak gave guidance on the topic of cyber security, saying that today the use of technology has increased everywhere, due to which people are often cheated. Cyber crimes have increased on a large scale, so cyber security is important to prevent such crimes. Although some laws have been made regarding cyber security, people should take care of themselves for cyber security. They advised that one should not go to a new app out of greed, and that calls from new numbers should be avoided.

Between 6 and 7 pm, Shri Subhash Dhage and Prof. Jayant Bobde guided the students and villagers on the topic of New Educational Policy 2020. New Educational Policy 2020 is a revolutionary policy. Objectives have been set in this policy from the perspective of fulfilling the expectations of Indian society. After 34 years, this policy is being seen as a revolutionary policy in the educational sector. It is necessary for everyone to understand this policy. Only if everyone understands this policy can it be implemented well and the expected objectives can be achieved, Shri Subhash Dhage asserted. The new educational policy opens doors of different opportunities for the youth. Various opportunities will be created for the youth through this. Dr. Jayant Bobde asserted that this policy will help in creating students with all qualities and skills.

Music Rajni was organized in cultural programs between 8 and 10 pm. On this occasion, Head of the Music Department Savita Kokate and various professors and students of the Music Department won the hearts of the students and villagers through the performance of different songs. This musical Rajni received a great response from the villagers.

Day Six

On the sixth day, i.e. on January 7, 2025, yoga pranayama and meditation were done from 5 to 7 in the morning, after which the students of Group F took the ritual. After that, breakfast was served. Anemia blood test camp was conducted for the youth of the camp from 9 to 11 in the morning. On this occasion, the team from Parbhani District Hospital conducted anemia blood test of the youth of the camp. On this occasion, the blood of 81 campers was tested. Their reports were given to the campers after two days. At the same time, Shramdaan was held between 9 am and 12 pm, during this time the main roads of the village were cleaned and various coins were cleaned.

In the afternoon, in the intellectual session, Mr. Arjun Rathod guided on the topic of AIDS society and misconceptions, while Professor Manoj Bhate Deshmukh guided on the topic of women empowerment, the need of the hour. Arjun Rathod, while guiding on the topic of AIDS society and misconceptions, gave detailed guidance on what are the various misconceptions about AIDS and how they should be removed. He also asserted that this disease is not considered a serious disease today because proper care is taken

for it and a solution plan is also being made for that disease and that public awareness has been created about it. He asserted that while guiding on the topic of women empowerment, the need of the hour, Pranjali Bharti guided on the topic of women empowerment, women empowerment has become the need of today's women. Today, women are educated and have started working in different fields. But still she is not given the rights she wants, which she should be given. Although laws have been made for this, men themselves have asserted that it is necessary to give women freedom in all fields today. Dr. Vrushali Phuge said that women are starting to work, are starting to earn money and are standing on their own feet, but still the problems in their lives have not reduced, for this, the society needs to come forward and support women. Swati Deshmukh said that gender equality cannot be achieved by just teaching, but it needs to be brought into practice step by step. For this, it is necessary to show boys and girls from the beginning that men and women are one hundred percent equal, and that only then will gender equality be achieved, she asserted. Deshmukh Gayatri moderated the program, while Ambhure Nirjala expressed her gratitude.

Between 6 and 7 pm, Shri Manikpuri guided on the topic of the role of birds and animals in forest conservation. At this time, he said that forest conservation has become important today. The amount of forest on earth and the forest is very low. In addition, deforestation has started on a large scale and the number of fires in the forests has also started. Due to this, the balance of the environment is being threatened due to the large-scale degradation of forests. Just as the role of youth is important in environmental conservation, the role of birds and animals in the forest is also important. Birds and animals play an important role in forest conservation more than humans. He explained that different birds eat different fruits and the seeds of those fruits fall in the forest, which produces many trees. Even though the birds eat the fruits, they are trying to conserve the forest from them. It is not just a reward, but animals also play an important role in forest conservation. If animals and birds are conserving the forest, it is necessary for humans to try to solve various future problems by conserving the trees, Manikpuri said.

Between 8 and 10 pm The participants of the camp performed various talent shows. During this time, the campers showcased their various talents and presented them to the villagers through various qualities such as dancing, singing, playing, comedy, etc. It received a great response from the villagers.

Day Seven

Date 8 January 2024 Seventh day of the camp. On this day, yoga pranayama was done from 5 to 7 in the morning. After this, the ritual was performed. After tea and breakfast at 8 o'clock, an awareness morning procession was taken out from the village. During the morning procession, slogans were given on the topics of village cleanliness, elimination of superstitions, environmental conservation, daughter protection - daughter education, female foeticide, voter awareness, digital literacy, etc., and awareness was created.

After this, the concluding program of the camp began at 11 am. The program was presided over by Principal Dr. Babasaheb Jadhav. Parbhani Probationary Superintendent of Police Hrishikesh Shinde, Assistant Commissioner of Skill Employment Department Prashant Khandare, Police Inspector Mahesh

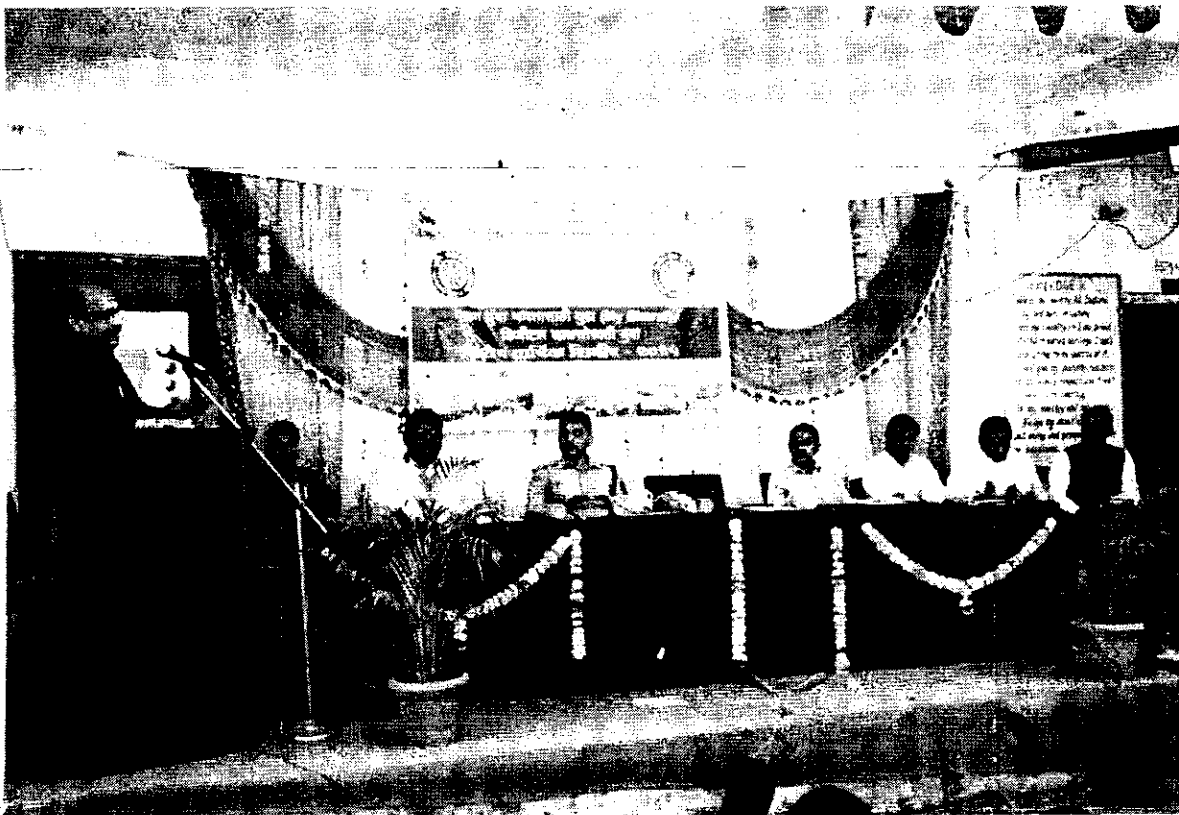

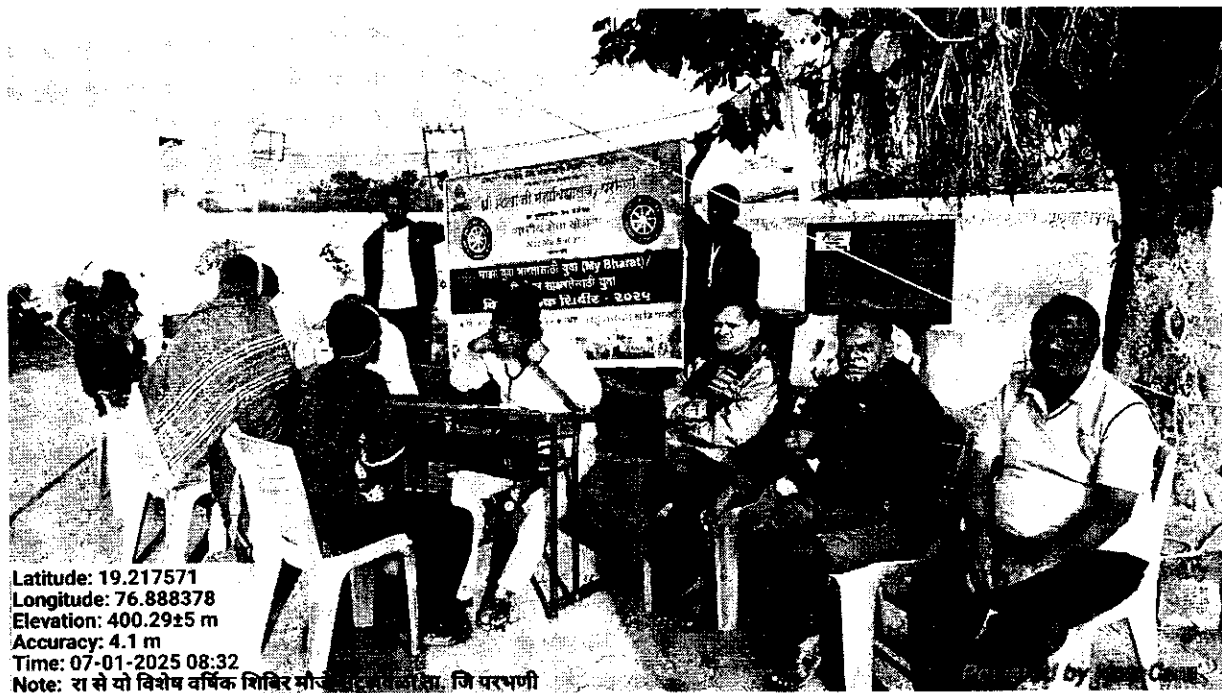

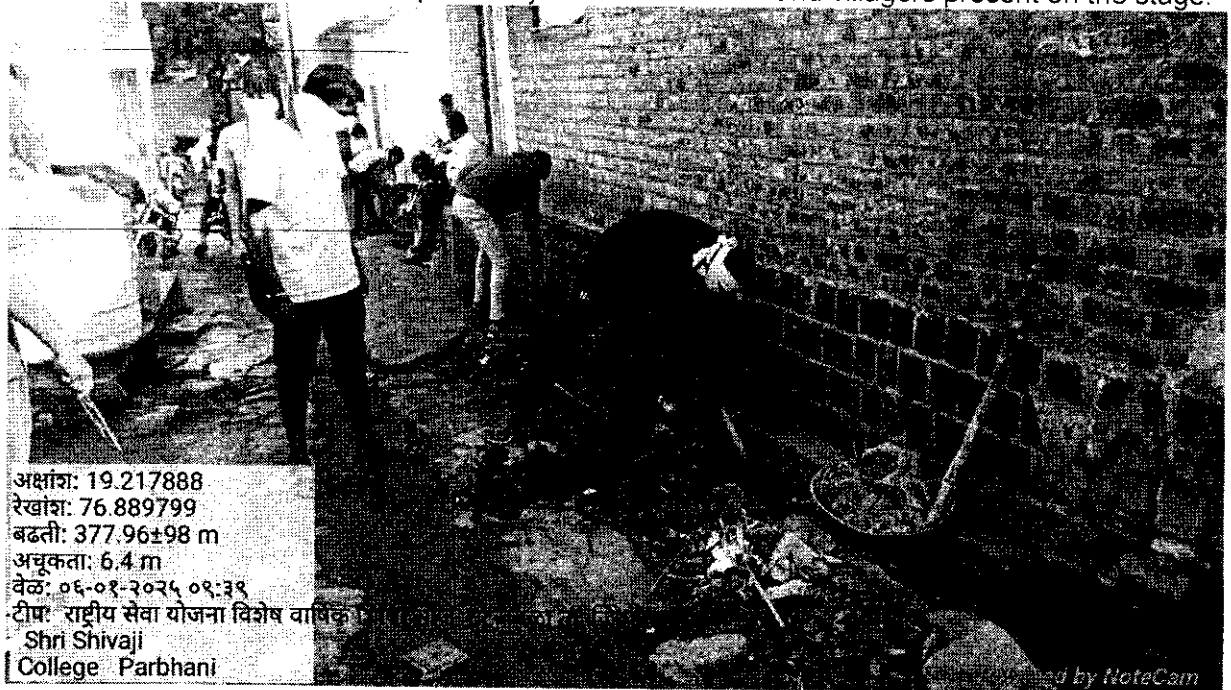

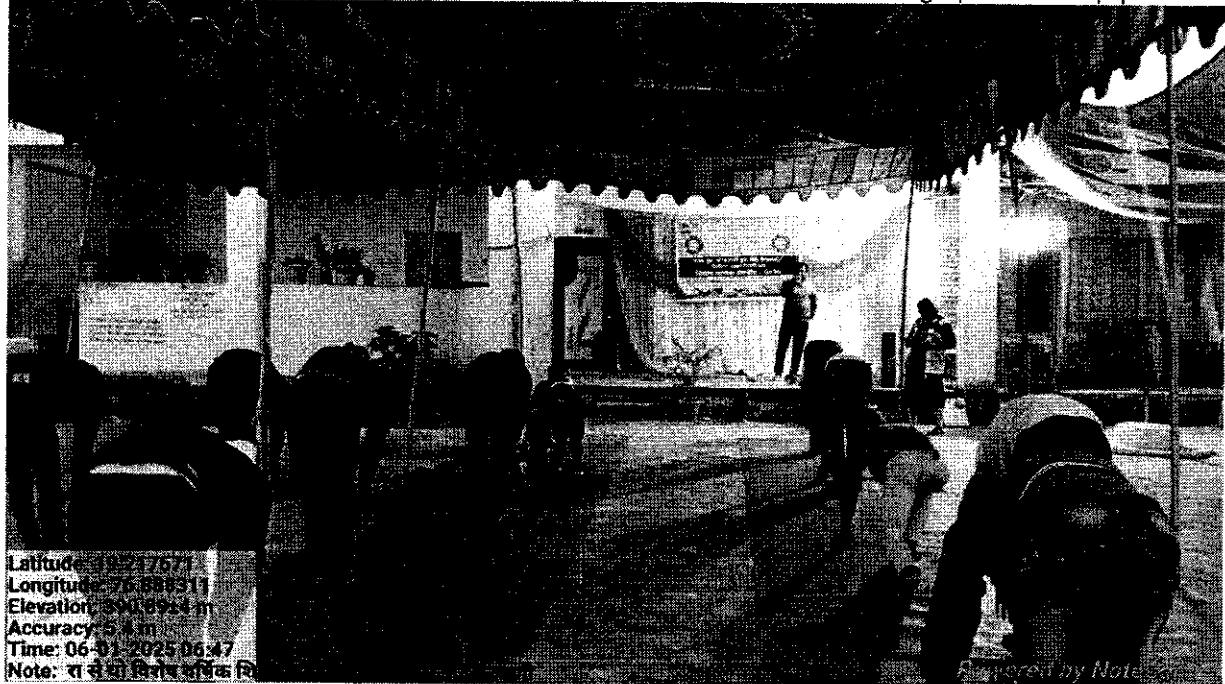
