Youth for Sustainable Development: Special Emphasis on Water Conservation Management and
Wasteland Development — Special Annual Camp – 2026
Date: January 17 to 23, 2026
Report

Day One

On January 2, 2026, at 2:00 PM, all camp participants assembled at the college to depart for the campsite. A total of 138 participants—comprising 40 male students and 98 female students—departed from the college by vehicle, carrying the necessary camp supplies, and headed towards the village of Tattu-Jawala (Taluka & District: Parbhani). Upon arrival, the volunteers cleaned the designated accommodation area within the school premises, as well as the surrounding school campus. Following discussions with the villagers, they conducted inquiries and surveys regarding the specific tasks to be undertaken within the village. At 8:00 PM, after an introductory session for the participants, the group was divided into a total of six distinct teams. A comprehensive plan was formulated outlining the work to be accomplished by the students over the course of the seven-day camp. For each team, a Team Leader and a Deputy Team Leader were elected, and the responsibility for managing their respective teams was entrusted to them.

Day Two

On the second day of the camp specifically January 18, 2026—between the hours of 5:00 AM and 7:00 AM, the participating Volunteers engaged in physical exercises, *Pranayama*, and Yoga under the guidance of the Program Officer, Prof. Dr. Tukaram Fisfise. Following this session, the first team conducted the morning assembly (*Paripath*). This assembly featured various segments, including prayers, inspirational quotes, moral-building stories, and a quiz competition. Subsequently, between 8:00 AM and 10:00 AM, a *Shramdan* (voluntary labor) drive was carried out within the premises of the Zilla Parishad School.

At 11:00 AM, the camp's inaugural ceremony commenced. The event was inaugurated by the *Krishibhushan* awardee and social worker, Hon. Shri Kantrao Deshmukh, while the Principal of the college, Dr. Balasaheb Jadhav, presided over the function. Prominent dignitaries present on this occasion included Hon. Maroti Gaikwad (Director of the National Service Scheme at S.R.T.M. University), Hon. Engr. Narayan Chaudhary (Member of the Management Council), Sarpanch Narayanrao Kadam, and the Program Officer, Dr. [Name]. Tukaram Fisfise, Headmaster Rambhau Shinde, Chairman Ravi Kadam, School Committee President Tukaram Kadam, Supervisor Prof. Sanjay Dhawale, Kishan Kadam, Gram Panchayat Member Mauli Kadam, Dadarao Kadam, Bhagwan Kadam, Bandu Kadam, Suresh Kadam, Anand Kadam, Shriram Kadam, Arjun Kadam, Sadashiv Kadam, and others were present on this occasion.

Speaking at the event, Kantrao Deshmukh remarked that competition is intensifying day by day in every field; indeed, education has increasingly come to be equated solely with securing a job. In our agrarian nation, however, numerous opportunities have emerged within the agricultural sector. In this context, he appealed to the youth to focus on adopting modern farming techniques alongside their formal education. He further noted that agriculture holds a position of great significance in Western nations. Farming possesses the inherent power to yield a hundred grains for every single grain sown. He urged the youth to reflect upon this reality and, while pursuing their education, strive to validate the adage:

"Excellent farming is superior to a mediocre job." Offering guidance during the program, Dr. Maroti Gaikwad stated that, in accordance with the teachings of the saints, tree plantation for environmental conservation is the need of the hour. He emphasized that the youth represent the future of tomorrow's India; therefore, they should cultivate positive values, uphold social harmony, and remain prepared to engage in social work by actively encouraging movements such as blood donation and organ donation. Delivering the presidential concluding remarks, Principal Dr. Balasaheb Jadhav highlighted how the National Service Scheme (NSS) has played a pivotal role in shaping the character of numerous students, noting that in many villages, former NSS volunteers are currently serving as *Sarpanchs* (village heads), driven by a genuine spirit of social service. Dr. Digambar Rode presented the introductory remarks for the program. Dr. Tukaram Fisfise served as the master of ceremonies, while Prof. Vilas Kurhadkar proposed the vote of thanks.

Program Officer Prof. Savita Kokate, Prof. Sharad Kadam, Dr. Prof. Rajesaheb Renge, Mrs. Limkar, Arun Kadam, Sayyad Sadik, Achyut Tarafade, Dasu Maske, and others took the initiative to ensure the success of the event. The program was attended by 138 students, alongside various villagers.

The program concluded with the singing of the National Anthem. During the afternoon session held between 3:00 PM and 5:00 PM, lectures were delivered by Dr. Babu Bhosale on the subject of "Water Conservation Management" and by Prof. Rajendra Wayal on the topic of "Youth for Sustainable Development."

Speaking on the occasion, Dr. Bhosale emphasized that water conservation management has become the need of the hour; consequently, various initiatives regarding water conservation have been undertaken from the perspective of environmental preservation. Although water constitutes the largest proportion of the Earth's surface, potable water accounts for only 3 percent of the total. Global warming has disrupted the ecological balance, leading to increased irregularity in rainfall. Furthermore, the large-scale extraction of groundwater has resulted in a severe water crisis. Dr. Bhosale asserted that if water is not managed properly, humanity will have to face a major crisis in the future. He urged the public to become aware of this impending danger, prioritize water conservation, and actively engage in its management to avert this crisis.

Following this, Prof. Rajendra Wayal observed that, in today's world, every nation places a strong emphasis on development. However, the pursuit of development often results in immense damage to the environment. Development achieved at the cost of environmental degradation does not truly benefit humanity; rather, it ultimately causes harm to human society. While development is indeed a societal necessity, it must be enduring and perpetual—that is, it must be "sustainable development." Sustainable development has gained significant importance in contemporary times. The youth play a pivotal role in this process of sustainable development, as they serve as the very pillars of the nation. Prof. Wayal asserted that young people can play a crucial role in driving sustainable development by fostering public awareness regarding the concept within society.

In the evening, between 8:00 PM and 10:00 PM, the humor poet Shankar Kadam entertained the audience by reciting a variety of poems.

Day Three

On the third day of the camp—specifically January 19, 2026—between 5:00 AM and 7:00 AM, Art of Living yoga instructors Mr. Akshay Raskatla and Mr. Gajanan Kotlawar explained the significance of Pranayama and Yogasanas to the Volunteers, subsequently conducting scientific and systematic training sessions in these disciplines. Program Officers Dr. Tukaram Fisfise and Prof. Rajesaheb Renge were present on this occasion. During this time, the Volunteers conducted the morning assembly.

Following this, tea and breakfast were served at 8:00 AM. From 9:00 AM sharp until 12:00 PM, a livestock inspection and vaccination camp was organized. During this event, 35 animals from the village—including cows, buffaloes, and oxen—were examined and vaccinated. The inspections and vaccinations were carried out by Dr. Shahid Deshmukh, Livestock Development Officer at the Pingali Veterinary Dispensary, and Dr. Prahlad Bhise, Livestock Supervisor at the Sadegaon Veterinary Dispensary. Program Officer Dr. Tukaram Fisfise, along with local villagers and the Volunteers, were present during this activity.

Concurrently, a group of students undertook a cleanliness drive, clearing weeds from the village's main road and the area surrounding the school. They cleaned the main road by collecting and disposing of litter, debris, and plastic waste.

In the afternoon, between 2:00 PM and 5:00 PM, an intellectual session was held featuring a lecture by Dr. Charudatta Bele on the subject of "Personality Development." Program Officer Dr. Vilas Kurhadkar and Dr. Kalyankar—Head of the Department of Mathematics at Dnyanopasak College, Parbhani—were present on the dais during this session. Dr. Bele emphasized that personality development has gained immense importance in today's world, and students must therefore focus their attention on cultivating it. Acquiring various skills is essential for holistic personality development; students should prioritize the acquisition of such skills alongside their academic studies. The National Service Scheme (NSS) serves as a vital platform that facilitates the acquisition of precisely these kinds of diverse skills. It was asserted that this medium aids in the holistic development of the students' personalities. On this occasion, Dr. Kalyankar also offered guidance to the students. Prof. Vilas Kurhadkar delivered the concluding presidential remarks. The program was anchored by Dnyaneshwar Giri, while Manmath Chavan proposed the vote of thanks.

During the evening cultural session, a poets' meet was held between 8:00 PM and 10:00 PM. Poets Prof. Dr. Prahlad Bhope, Dr. Swati Deshmukh, Dr. Archana Bang, Gayatri Khiste, Archana Sambarkar, and Atul Vairat participated in this event. On this occasion, all these poets presented their eloquent poems on diverse themes such as the soil, agriculture, culture, farmers, love, the girl child, college life, modern technology, motherhood, and social harmony. The session was anchored by Prof. Dr. Prahlad Bhope, and Dr. Tukaram Fisfise proposed the vote of thanks. The students and villagers responded enthusiastically to these poetic recitations.

Day Four

January 20, 2025—marking the fourth day of the camp. On this day, between 5:00 AM and 7:00 AM, the Volunteers received guidance from Art of Living yoga instructors, Mr. Akshay Raskatla and Mr. Gajanan Kotlawar. During this session, they emphasized the significance of yoga to the students.

Following this, the daily morning assembly (*Paripath*) was conducted by Group 'C'. Subsequently, at 8:00 AM, breakfast and tea were served. At 9:00 AM, all Volunteers, equipped with the necessary tools and materials, set out into the village to engage in *Shramdan* (voluntary labor). During this activity, the village drainage channels were cleaned; silt was removed from clogged drains to restore their flow, and soak pits were constructed within the village premises. The entire sanitation drive was carried out under the supervision and guidance of the Program Officers.

Between 12:00 PM and 2:00 PM, the Volunteers took their baths and had lunch. Thereafter, the intellectual session commenced. During this session, a lecture was delivered by Mr. Subhash Shinde on the topic: "The Role of Youth in Environmental Conservation." Present on the dais on this occasion were Program Officer Dr. Tukaram Fisfise, Prof. Sharad Kadam, Prof. Rajesaheb Renge, and Prof. Vilas Kurhadkar. Speaking at the event, Shinde remarked that the issue of the environment has become

extremely critical today, thereby endangering the very existence of society. Driven by self-interest, humans are neglecting the environment. The government's stance on this matter also appears indifferent. Although the environment demands the utmost attention today, it is not receiving the focus it deserves. This neglect has given rise to numerous problems. The youth must recognize their responsibility and play a pivotal role in environmental conservation. To this end, public awareness must be generated through various media channels. He asserted that, when necessary, it is also essential to point out the government's shortcomings, and that the youth are uniquely positioned to play a crucial role in this endeavor. On this occasion, Program Officer Dr. Tukaram Fisfise also offered guidance to the students. The program was anchored by Arjun Kale, while the vote of thanks was proposed by Dhage Shivam.

Between 7:00 PM and 8:00 PM, Adv. Ramkishan Dhas delivered a session on the topic, "The Importance of Law for a Developed India." During his address, he elucidated the concept of a 'Developed India' and impressed upon the students the critical significance of laws for the nation. He noted that numerous laws have been enacted to facilitate the development of India, and that the first step is to gain a thorough understanding of these statutes. He expressed the view that studying these laws reveals their true importance; therefore, the youth should take the initiative to study such legislation and play an active role in ensuring its effective implementation.

A cultural program was held between 8:00 PM and 10:00 PM.

Day Five

On January 21, 2025—marking the fifth day of the camp—participants received guidance from Art of Living yoga instructors Mr. Akshay Raskatla and Mr. Gajanan Kotlawar between 5:00 AM and 7:00 AM. This session was followed by the morning assembly, after which breakfast and tea were served. From 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM, a community service drive (*Shramdan*) was conducted within the village. During this time, the area adjacent to the village's Mahadev Temple was cleaned; basins were dug around the trees to facilitate watering, and the surrounding premises were thoroughly tidied up.

During the afternoon intellectual sessions, lectures were delivered on two key topics: Dr. Dnyaneshwar Chavan spoke on "Today's Youth: Drug-Free," while Dr. Vaibhav Pathak addressed the subject of "Cyber Security." Present on the dais during these sessions were Program Officer Dr. Tukaram Fisfise, Prof. Sharad Kadam, Prof. Rajesaheb Renge, and Prof. Vilas Kurhadkar. While guiding the audience on the theme of a drug-free youth, Dr. Chavan asserted that the youth represent the future of India; they are the very pillars upon which the nation stands. However, these pillars have begun to waver, as today's youth are falling prey to drug addiction on a massive scale. This addiction has placed their lives in jeopardy and poses a significant threat to their families, society, and the nation as a whole. Consequently, liberating the youth from the clutches of addiction has emerged as a formidable challenge. Dr. Chavan emphasized that young people must not only keep themselves away from drugs but also actively dissuade their peers who are succumbing to addiction. To achieve this, he urged the youth to spearhead public awareness campaigns within society and to keep themselves constructively engaged in positive endeavors. Subsequently, while addressing the topic of Cyber Security, Dr. Vaibhav Pathak highlighted the pervasive increase in the use of technology across all spheres of life today. He noted that this technological expansion has frequently led to instances of fraud and a substantial surge in cybercrimes. He concluded by emphasizing that robust cyber security measures are indispensable for preventing and combating such criminal activities. Although various laws have been enacted regarding cyber security, individuals must take personal responsibility for their own safety in the digital realm. It was emphasized that one should not be lured into using new applications out of greed or temptation, and should strictly avoid answering calls from unknown numbers. Students were advised to exercise caution

while using social media platforms and to be vigilant when conducting any online transactions. Since young people are the most frequent victims of cyber fraud, it is imperative that they remain alert and aware of these risks. Following this, Prof. Surve also provided guidance to the students on the subject of cyber security. During the session, the dignitaries provided satisfactory answers to various questions raised by the students. The program was anchored by Sheikh Fayyaz, while the vote of thanks was delivered by Ajay Ranvir.

In the evening, between 8:00 PM and 10:00 PM, a 'Musical Evening' (*Sangeet Rajani*) was organized as part of the cultural festivities. During this event, faculty members from the Department of Music—Prof. Amol Gavai, Prof. M.A. Kate, and Prof. Ankush Khating—joined by students from their department, captivated the audience and won the hearts of both students and villagers by presenting a delightful repertoire of devotional songs, Qawwalis, Gondhal, Powadas, and popular Marathi and Hindi songs. This musical evening received an overwhelming response from the local villagers.

Day Six

On the sixth day—specifically January 22, 2025—a session on Yoga, Pranayama, and Meditation was conducted between 5:00 AM and 7:00 AM. This was followed by the students conducting the morning assembly (*Paripath*), after which breakfast was served. From 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM, a free health check-up camp was organized. During this camp, various parameters such as blood group, blood pressure, blood sugar levels, and hemoglobin levels were screened. Men and women from the village availed themselves of these diagnostic services. A total of 65 patients were examined during the camp. The successful execution of this health camp was facilitated by the assistance of Prof. Dr. Hanumant Jagtap and Dr. Sachin Yewale from the Department of Zoology at Shri Shivaji College, along with five male and five female students from their department. The day concluded with a lecture delivered by Prof. Dr. Hanumant Jagtap on the topic: "Tantra and Mantra" (Technique and Principle). During this session, participants were encouraged to dispel any fear of interviews from their minds. Comprehensive guidance was provided regarding the precautions to be taken while appearing for an interview, the aspects to prioritize, appropriate attire for the occasion, and how to project confidence on one's face.

Concurrently, a *Shramdan* (voluntary labor) drive was organized, during which the road situated in front of the village's Mahadev Temple was cleaned. The road was cleared of weeds—specifically *Gajar Gavat* (Parthenium)—and thoroughly cleaned. The road adjacent to the cremation ground was also cleaned during this drive. Following this, a tree-plantation drive was conducted within the premises of the Mahadev Temple. The school principal and the teaching staff were present on this occasion. Ten saplings each of Mahogany and Banyan trees were planted during this event.

During the afternoon intellectual session, commencing at 2:00 PM, Dr. Shrinivas Keshatti, the Vice-Principal of the college, addressed and guided the students. Prof. Dr. Surendra Yenorkar was also present on the dais during this session. Subsequently, Ms. Priya Jondhale from the NGO 'SEVA' delivered a lecture on the topic, "The Prevention of Child Marriage: The Need of the Hour." Program Officer Dr. Tukaram Fisfise and school teacher Mrs. Yadav were present on the dais during this lecture. While speaking on the occasion, Ms. Jondhale asserted that child marriage constitutes a significant impediment to India's development. She noted that the prevalence of child marriage is highest in Maharashtra, and within the state, the Parbhani district stands at the forefront of this issue. Child marriage has adverse consequences on society, and it places the lives of young girls at risk. Although child marriage is a punishable offense under the law, its rising prevalence remains a matter of grave concern. It is imperative to raise public awareness regarding child marriage, and the students of the National Service Scheme

(NSS) are well-positioned to carry out this task effectively. She emphasized that the students must take the initiative to lead this effort.

Following this, Dr. Ramesh Shinde delivered a session on the subject of Digital Literacy. Speaking on the occasion, he noted that financial transactions today are no longer conducted solely through cash—the traditional method—but are increasingly being carried out using modern digital methods. The use of digital tools has expanded significantly in recent times. Even people in rural villages have begun engaging in digital transactions; however, due to a lack of adequate knowledge regarding these digital methods, people are falling victim to fraud on a large scale. Consequently, digital literacy has become an absolute necessity. Dr. Shinde emphasized that digital tools must be utilized correctly—and only after acquiring complete information about them—as this is the only way to effectively prevent fraud. The program was anchored by Baliram Jawade, while the vote of thanks was proposed by Yash Dhulgunde.

Between 6:00 PM and 7:00 PM, Mr. Manik Puri delivered a session on the topic, "The Role of Birds and Animals in Forest Conservation." During his address, he highlighted that forest conservation has become a matter of critical importance today. The total forest cover on Earth has dwindled significantly. Furthermore, deforestation is occurring on a massive scale, and the frequency of forest fires has also been on the rise. This widespread degradation of forests has placed the ecological balance of the environment in jeopardy. He asserted that birds and animals inhabiting the forests play a crucial role in environmental conservation—indeed, they often play an even more significant role in preserving forests than humans do. He explained that various bird species consume different types of fruits, and as a result, the seeds of those fruits are dispersed throughout the forest floor. This process leads to the growth of numerous trees; thus, even while simply feeding on fruits, birds are actively contributing to the conservation of the forest. Mr. Manik Puri concluded by emphasizing that if animals and birds are actively engaged in conserving forests, then humans must not lag behind; rather, it is imperative that we make concerted efforts to conserve forests with the specific objective of resolving the various environmental challenges that lie ahead in the future. During his session, he also mimicked the calls of various birds and explained the specific purpose or message conveyed by each distinct sound, noting that birds utilize their vocalizations to communicate a variety of messages. Between 8:00 PM and 10:00 PM, the participating Volunteers organized a cultural variety program. During this event, the Volunteers showcased their diverse artistic talents through various mediums such as dance, singing, instrumental music, comedy, mimicry, and short skits. Through these performances, they not only entertained the villagers but also conveyed various social messages. The program received an overwhelming response from the villagers.

Day Seven

On January 23, 2026—the seventh day of the camp—a session on Yoga and Pranayama was conducted between 5:00 AM and 7:00 AM. This was followed by the morning assembly. Tea and breakfast were served at 8:00 AM. Subsequently, an awareness-raising morning procession (*Prabhat Pheri*) was organized through the village. During the procession, public awareness was generated through slogans addressing various themes such as village sanitation, the eradication of superstition, environmental conservation, the 'Save the Daughter, Educate the Daughter' (*Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao*) campaign, the prevention of female feticide, voter awareness, and digital literacy. At various village squares, the participating Volunteers performed street plays (*Pathanaty*) to raise voter awareness, earnestly appealing to the public to cast their votes honestly and without succumbing to any inducements. Along with the Volunteers, students from the local Zilla Parishad School also participated in this morning procession.

Following this, the camp's valedictory ceremony commenced at 11:00 AM. Principal Dr. Balasaheb Jadhav presided over the function. The event was graced by the presence of Police Inspector Hon. Mahadev Manjarmakar as the Chief Guest, and Hon. Keshavanna Dudhate—an invited member of the College Development Committee—as a distinguished guest. Also present on the dais were Sarpanch Narayanrao Kadam, Deputy Sarpanch Madanrao Kadam, Chairman Ravi Kadam, Headmaster Rambhau Shinde, Sadashivrao Kadam, and Program Officer Dr. Tukaram Fisfise.

Speaking on the occasion, Mahadev Manjarmakar highlighted that, in comparison to the global youth population, India possesses the largest youth demographic in the world. The youth are poised to play a pivotal role in India's development; however, having become overly engrossed in social media, they are currently suffering physical and mental detriment. In light of this, it was emphasized that young people should exercise discretion in their use of social media to achieve their goals, prioritizing their careers over social platforms—which were identified as a major impediment to succeeding in today's competitive environment.

Speaking on this occasion, Principal Jadhav remarked that the National Service Scheme (NSS) fosters the holistic personality development of students. He noted that such camps play a crucial role in shaping the character of students, urging them to utilize the lessons learned during the camp for the betterment of society. He added that the valuable insights and experiences gained during the camp serve as an essential resource for students as they navigate their lives within society. The camp report was presented by Prof. Dr. Tukaram Fisfise. During the event, students and teams who demonstrated outstanding performance during the camp were felicitated by the dignitaries present. The program was anchored by Nirjala Ambhure, while Prof. Sharad Kadam proposed the vote of thanks. Dr. Digambar Rode, Prof. Savita Kokate, Prof. Rajesaheb Renge, Prof. Maya Rodge, Arun Kadam, Achyut Tarafade, Dasu Maske, and others worked diligently to ensure the success of the event. Following the meal, at 5:00 PM, all students—accompanied by the program officers—departed for the college, arriving back at the campus at 6:00 PM.

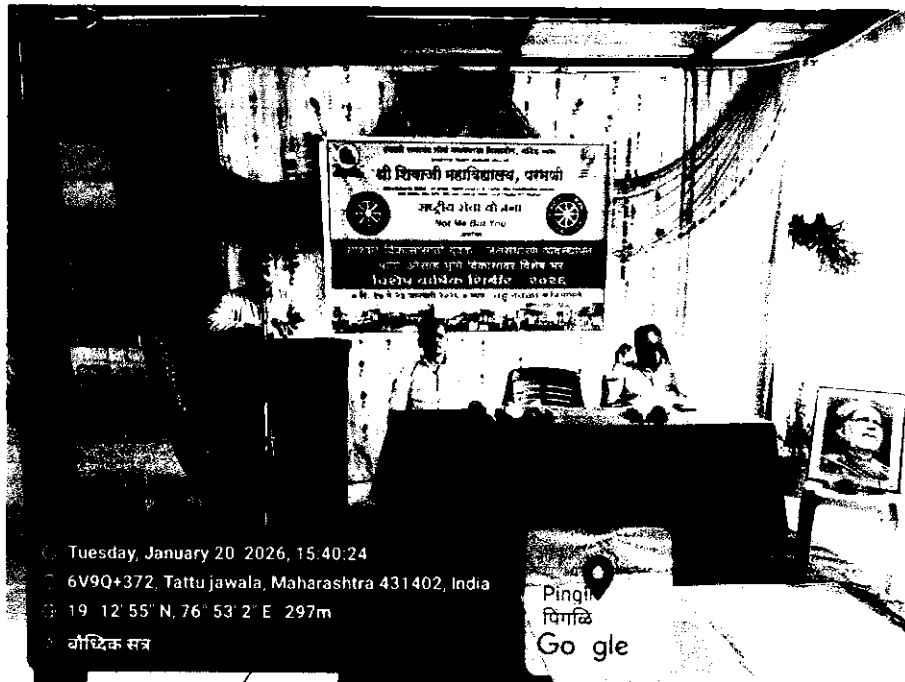

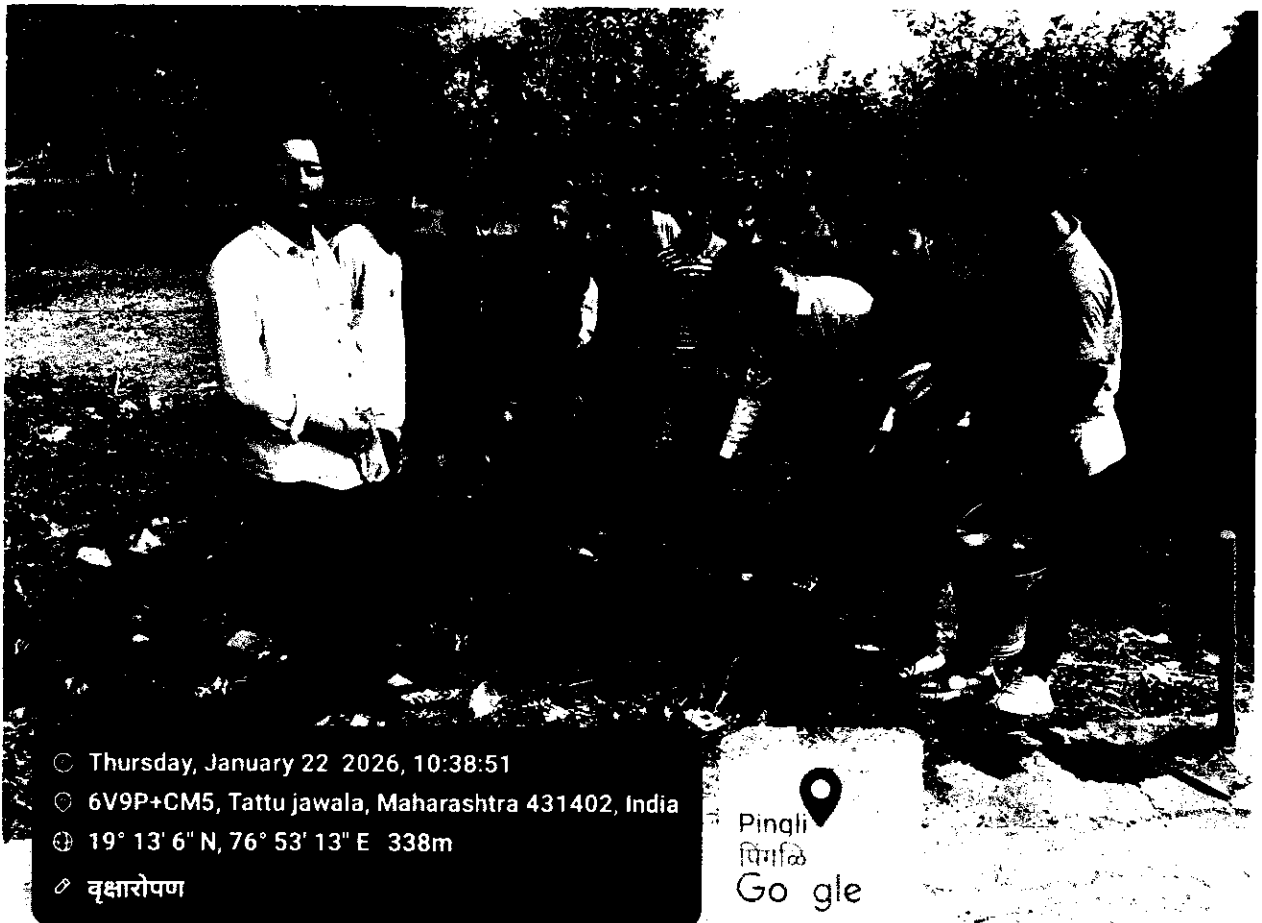

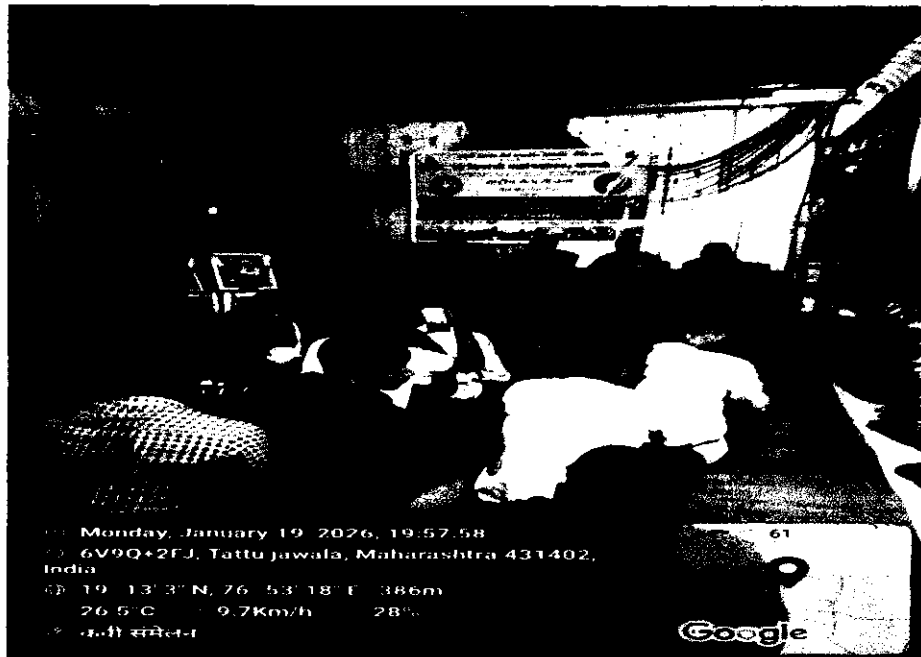

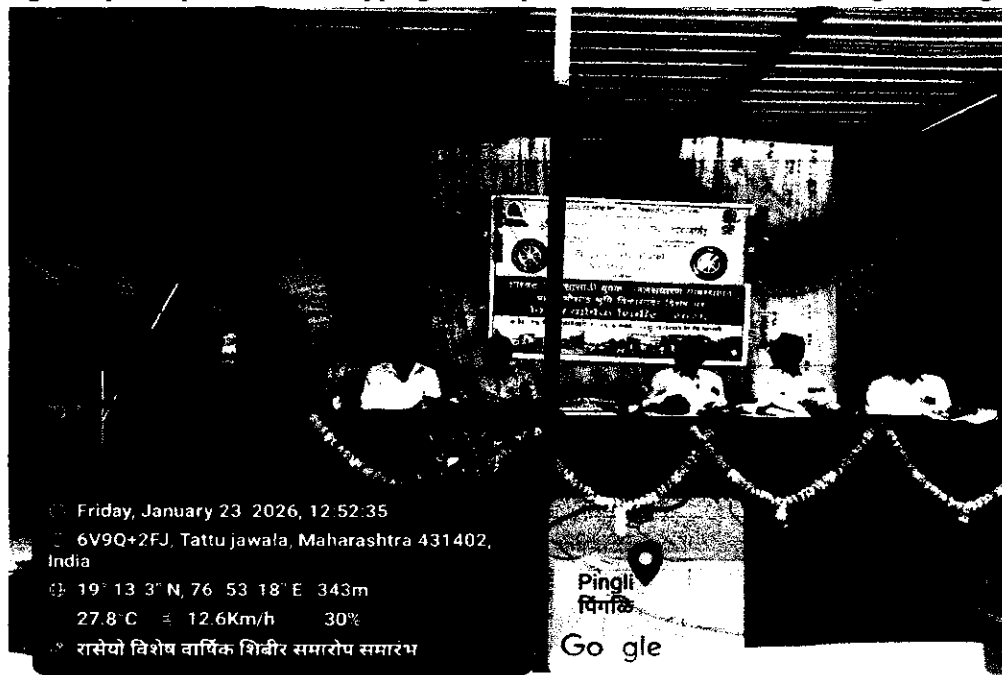
Students cleaning the village drains during the camp.



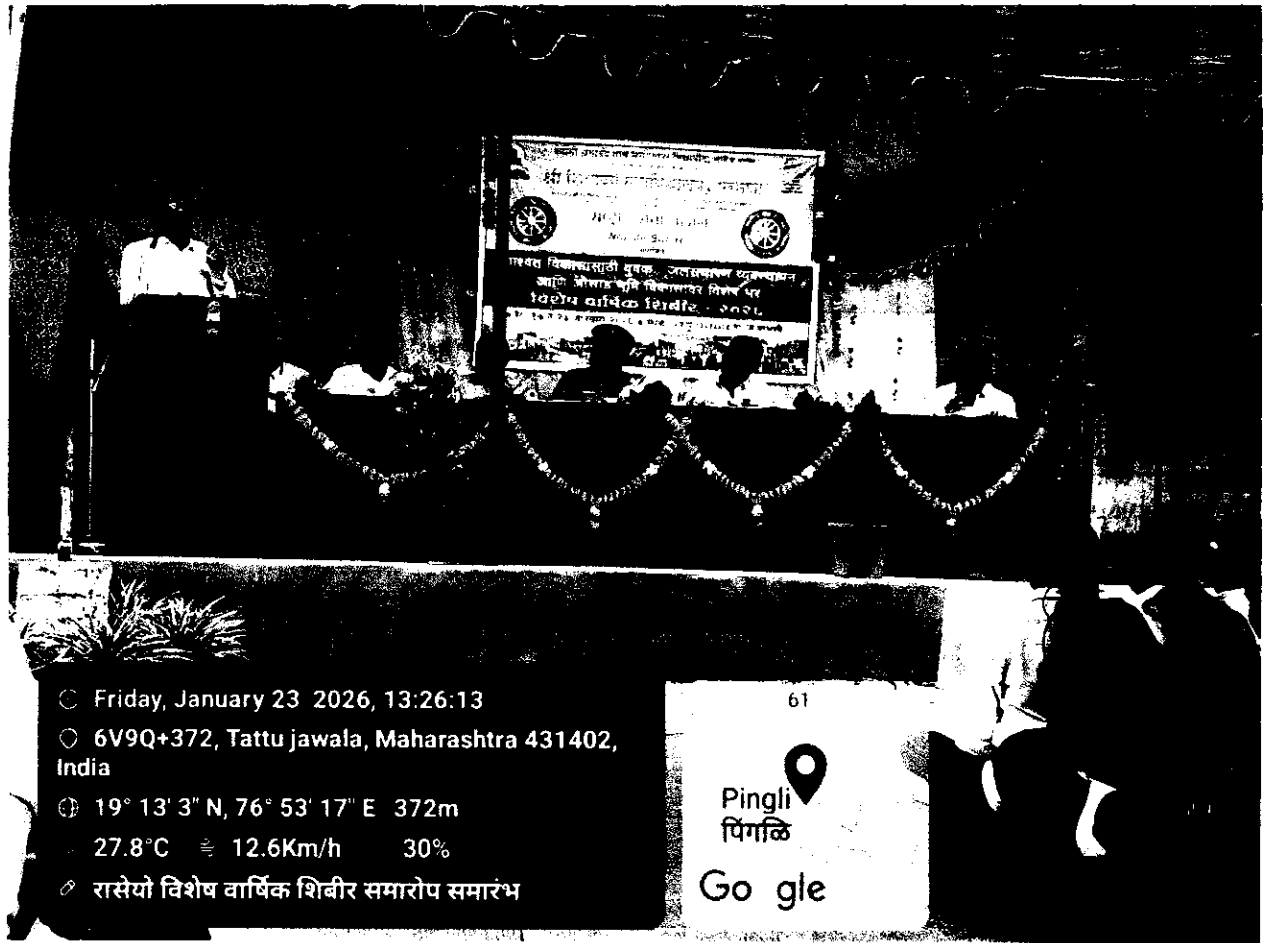

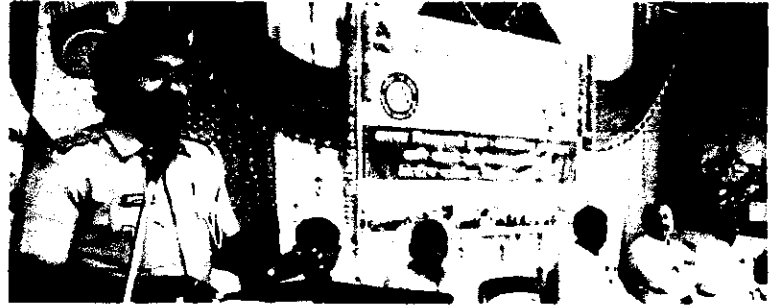
